



## **PASS AND PRIZE LIST**

May 2023 Examination

The Association of Taxation Technicians, the oldest and largest body concerned solely with tax compliance, announced today the results of its examinations taken by 838 candidates in May 2023 with an additional 1,010 sitting some ATT papers on the ATT CTA Tax Pathway. The Association reports that a high standard of performance was achieved by many candidates.

The Association President, Simon Groom, commenting upon the results said:

“I am delighted to congratulate all the successful candidates from the May sitting of our exams. In total 838 ATT candidates and 556 ATT CTA Tax Pathway candidates sat 1,907 papers and 1,432 passes were achieved. 93 distinctions were awarded to candidates for outstanding performance.

With my background in tax education I am well aware of the many hours of study required to sit our examinations and I commend all the candidates for putting in the work necessary to achieve success.

The ATT’s modular system means that candidates can study at their own pace, within the five-year registration period, whether they are working towards full membership or simply wishing to obtain one or more Certificates of Competency in their specialist area.

I look forward to meeting the candidates who take up membership at our next Admission’s Ceremony.”

### **The Association Medal**

The Association Medal has been awarded to Katherine Sasha Louise Katovsky of Nottingham, who is employed by PwC in Castle Donington.

*The Association Medal is awarded to the candidate achieving first time passes in all the required tax exams including the CBEs over a 12 month period.*

### **The Ivison Medal**

The Ivison Medal has been awarded to Helen Knight of Solihull.

*The Ivison Medal is awarded to the candidate with the highest mark in Paper 1 – Personal Taxation.*

### **The Jennings Medal**

The Jennings Medal has been awarded to Helen Knight of Solihull, winner of the Ivison Medal.

*The Jennings Medal is awarded to the candidate with the highest mark in Paper 2 – Business Taxation.*

### **The Collingwood Medal**

The Collingwood Medal has been awarded to Simeon Lee of Haywards Heath, who is employed by Deloitte LLP in London.

*The Collingwood Medal is awarded to the candidate with the highest mark in Paper 3 – Business Compliance.*

### **The Stary Medal**

The Stary Medal has been awarded to Emily Hurdley of Sheffield, who is employed by Cooper Parry Group Ltd in Castle Donington.

*The Stary Medal is awarded to the candidate with the highest mark in Paper 4 – Corporate Taxation.*

### **The Kimmer Medal**

The Kimmer Medal has been awarded to Isobel Ruth Kimber of Harrogate where she is employed by Saffery Champness LLP.

*The Kimmer Medal is awarded to the candidate with the highest mark in Paper 5 – Inheritance Tax, Trusts & Estates.*

### **The Gravestock Medal**

The Gravestock Medal has been awarded to Aaron Norman of Gravesend, who is employed by MHA MacIntyre Hudson LLP in Maidstone.

*The Gravestock Medal is awarded to the candidate with the highest mark in Paper 6 – VAT.*

### **The Johnson Medal**

The Johnson Medal has been awarded to Noeline Jeevitha Nelson of Croydon where she is employed by Paperchase Accountancy.

*The Johnson Medal is awarded to the candidate with the best overall performance when passing the Computer Based Examinations in Professional Responsibilities & Ethics, Law and Principles of Accounting within a six month period.*

### **The Tolley Prize**

The Tolley Prize has been awarded to Evie May Patel of London where she is employed by EY.

*The Tolley Prize is awarded to the candidate taking three tax papers at one sitting and obtaining the highest total marks on those three papers.*

### **The President's Medal**

The President's Medal has been awarded to Lewis Dudley-Smith of Wrexham, who is employed by Deloitte LLP in London.

*The President's Medal is awarded at the discretion of the President to an outstanding candidate or candidates not otherwise eligible for a prize.*

Prizes and Medals are only awarded provided the papers are of a sufficiently high standard.

### **Distinctions**

Passes with Distinction for each Certificate paper are listed on the accompanying document.

Distinctions are only awarded to candidates whose answers reflect an exceptional level in a paper.

## **ATT Certificate paper results**

### Paper 1 – Personal Taxation

554 candidates passed this paper out of a total of 777 sitting the examination with 38 candidates being awarded a distinction. A pass rate of 71%.

### Paper 2 – Business Taxation

472 candidates passed this paper out of a total of 624 sitting the examination with 29 candidates being awarded a distinction. A pass rate of 76%.

### Paper 3 – Business Compliance

135 candidates passed this paper out of a total of 156 sitting the examination with 8 candidates being awarded a distinction. A pass rate of 87%.

### Paper 4 – Corporate Taxation

159 candidates passed this paper out of a total of 193 sitting the examination with 9 candidates being awarded a distinction. A pass rate of 82%.

### Paper 5 – Inheritance Tax, Trusts & Estates

60 candidates passed this paper out of a total of 87 sitting the examination with 5 candidates being awarded a distinction. A pass rate of 69%.

### Paper 6 – VAT

52 candidates passed this paper out of a total of 70 sitting the examination with 4 candidates being awarded a distinction. A pass rate of 74%.
