The Association of Taxation Technicians, the oldest and largest body concerned solely with tax compliance, announced today the results of its examinations taken by 789 candidates in November 2024 with an additional 1,137 sitting some ATT papers on the ATT CTA Tax Pathway. The Association reports that a high standard of performance was achieved by many candidates.

The Association President, Senga Prior, commenting upon the results said:

“I am delighted to congratulate all the successful candidates from the November sitting of our exams. In total 789 ATT candidates and 555 ATT CTA Tax Pathway candidates sat 1,787 papers and 1,309 passes were achieved. 90 distinctions were awarded to candidates for outstanding performance.

Having taken the exams myself I am well aware of the many hours of study required to sit our examinations and I commend all the candidates for putting in the work necessary to achieve success.

The ATT’s modular system means that candidates can study at their own pace, within the five-year registration period, whether they are working towards full membership or simply wishing to obtain one or more Certificates of Competency in their specialist area.

I look forward to meeting the candidates who take up membership at our next Admission Ceremony.”

The Association Medal

The Association Medal has been awarded to Scott Lewis Shepherd of London where he is employed by Deloitte LLP.

The Association Medal is awarded to the candidate passing their final exam at the current session and achieving the highest aggregate marks over all exams.

The Ivison Medal

The Ivison Medal has been awarded to Perla Hoffman of London where she is employed by Stone & Co Services Ltd.

The Ivison Medal is awarded to the candidate with the highest mark in Paper 1 – Personal Taxation.

The Jennings Medal

The Jennings Medal has been awarded to Zak William Rogers of Norwich where he is employed by Swinton Accountants.

The Jennings Medal is awarded to the candidate with the highest mark in Paper 2 – Business Taxation.

The Collingwood Medal

The Collingwood Medal has been awarded to Scott Lewis Shepherd of London, winner of the Association Medal and the Tolley Prize.

The Collingwood Medal is awarded to the candidate with the highest mark in Paper 3 – Business Compliance.

The Stary Medal

The Stary Medal has been awarded to Sophie Amelia Glaister of Bishop Middleham, who is employed by Evelyn Partners in Newcastle upon Tyne.

The Stary Medal is awarded to the candidate with the highest mark in Paper 4 – Corporate Taxation.

The Kimmer Medal

The Kimmer Medal has been awarded to Adam Wyatt of Leeds where he is employed by Forvis Mazars LLP.

The Kimmer Medal is awarded to the candidate with the highest mark in Paper 5 – Inheritance Tax, Trusts & Estates.

The Gravestock Medal

The Gravestock Medal has been awarded to Ciaran Shannon of London, who is employed by KPMG LLP in Manchester.

The Gravestock Medal is awarded to the candidate with the highest mark in Paper 6 – VAT.

The Johnson Medal

The Johnson Medal has been awarded to Alexander Griplas of London where he is employed by Deloitte LLP.

The Johnson Medal is awarded to the candidate with the best overall performance when passing the Computer Based Examinations in Professional Responsibilities & Ethics, Law and Principles of Accounting within a six month period.

The Tolley Prize

The Tolley Prize has been awarded to Scott Lewis Shepherd, winner of the Association Medal and the Collingwood Medal.

The Tolley Prize is awarded to the candidate taking three tax papers at one sitting and obtaining the highest total marks on those three papers.

The President's Medal

The President's Medal has been awarded to Joshua Alex Lowe of Dartford, who is employed by Deloitte LLP in London.

The President's Medal is awarded at the discretion of the President to an outstanding candidate or candidates not otherwise eligible for a prize.

Prizes and Medals are only awarded provided the papers are of a sufficiently high standard.

Distinctions

Passes with Distinction for each Certificate paper are listed on the accompanying document. Distinctions are only awarded to candidates whose answers reflect an exceptional level in a paper.

ATT Certificate paper results

Paper 1 – Personal Taxation

383 candidates passed this paper out of a total of 587 sitting the examination with 24 candidates being awarded a distinction. A pass rate of 65%.

Paper 2 – Business Taxation

460 candidates passed this paper out of a total of 585 sitting the examination with 31 candidates being awarded a distinction. A pass rate of 79%.

Paper 3 – Business Compliance

93 candidates passed this paper out of a total of 113 sitting the examination with 7 candidates being awarded a distinction. A pass rate of 82%.

Paper 4 – Corporate Taxation

245 candidates passed this paper out of a total of 301 sitting the examination with 16 candidates being awarded a distinction. A pass rate of 81%.

Paper 5 – Inheritance Tax, Trusts & Estates

81 candidates passed this paper out of a total of 133 sitting the examination with 7 candidates being awarded a distinction. A pass rate of 61%.

Paper 6 – VAT

47 candidates passed this paper out of a total of 68 sitting the examination with 5 candidates being awarded a distinction. A pass rate of 69%.
